

The CSAOHN Service Award

This award for **Outstanding Service** is an opportunity to recognize a member of the California State Association of Occupational Health Nurses (CSAOHN) that has exhibited exemplary service in Occupational Health. This can be a culmination of their performance in the organization, workplace, training, research, mentorship and/or a demonstration of their service in occupational health nursing.

Objectives

- To recognize at the state level, outstanding service, accomplishment and/or the striving for excellence in Occupational Health Nursing
- To encourage outstanding service by members at the local, state or national associations

General Information

The award recipient will receive a commemorative plaque and is eligible for additional recognition or compensation, as determined by the CSAOHN Board of Directors; and publication in CSAOHN.

Candidate Eligibility

- Minimum of one year (1) in the field of Occupational Health Nursing at the time of application
- Membership in CSAOHN

Application Recommended Requirement

- Candidate Statement: In a maximum of two typed double lined pages, describe professional and/or organizational service accomplishments, actions and goals
 - Pertinence to the profession of occupational health nursing
 - Contributions to occupational health nursing
 - Professional responsibilities/achievements
 - Activities or positions in professional affiliations
 - Collaboration, community or workforce service
- One Letter of Recommendation: Limited to a maximum of two pages.
